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INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

The International Society of Paediatric Oncology (SIOP) is the multidisciplinary society dedicated to children and adolescents with cancer around the world. Its membership comprises over 2,600 health professionals, researchers, families, and advocates from 130 countries. In 1994, the SIOP Nursing committee was formed following the inaugural nursing meeting at SIOP Paris. Over the years, SIOP's nursing community has grown, and its annual nursing programme has become a core forum for international networking, knowledge sharing, and collaboration. Moreover, SIOP nurses have advanced the science and care of children and adolescents with cancer and their families in diverse practice settings across the globe.

Recently, SIOP streamlined its nomenclature of committees, networks, and working groups across the Society with the SIOP Nursing Network formally established in October 2021. The Nursing Network is a global community of paediatric oncology nurse members and is also open to non-nurses. To guide our efforts, we established the 2023-2027 SIOP Nursing Network Strategic Plan. This plan aligns with the SIOP 2021-2025 Strategy and sets our vision, mission, core values, and strategic goals for the next five years. Health care and the context in which it is delivered is ever evolving. This plan is intended as a living document, with goals and activities that are adaptable to the priorities and needs of the Society and Nursing Network members.

SIOP NURSING NETWORK 2023 - 2027 STRATEGIC PLAN

STRATEGIC GOALS

GOAL 1: Advocate Globally for Children and Adolescents with Cancer and the Nurses who Care for Them

To meet this goal, the SIOP Nursing Network will:

- Launch advocacy campaigns to promote awareness of childhood and adolescent cancer nursing
- Promote global dissemination of the SIOP Baseline Nursing Standards
- Facilitate SIOP nurse participation in the WHO Global Initiative for Childhood Cancer and integration in SIOP's WHO workplan



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GOAL 2: Promote Clinical Excellence and Nursing Research to Improve Patient Outcomes

To meet this goal, the SIOP Nursing Network will:

- Support the development and implementation of nursing standards and best practices in diverse clinical settings
- Provide mentorship opportunities in research, evidence-based practice, quality improvement, and education
- Foster and promote opportunities for nursing research through scholarships and grants

GOAL 3: Facilitate Nursing Education and Training

To meet this goal, the SIOP Nursing Network will:

- Disseminate paediatric oncology nursing knowledge at the annual SIOP Nursing Congress
 Programme and Education Day
- Advance paediatric oncology nursing expertise through ongoing professional development and shared learning opportunities, including in multiple languages and through the SIOP Knowledge Centre

GOAL 4: Increase Nursing Membership and Engagement

To meet this goal, the SIOP Nursing Network will:

- Provide engagement opportunities including the development of Nursing Network working groups to foster an active year-round SIOP nursing community
- Develop a communication process for nurses engaged in key SIOP committees, networks, and initiatives/projects
- Recognize exceptional nurses through scholarships and awards
- Promote and expand membership benefits to nurses internationally
- Leverage the experience and expertise of former SIOP nurse leaders by creating opportunities for continued involvement

GOAL 5: Strengthen and Expand Strategic Partnerships

To meet this goal, the SIOP Nursing Network will:

- Appoint nurse representatives to key SIOP committees, networks, and initiatives/projects when invited to do so and in accordance with said party's terms of references
- Strengthen collaborations and engagement with the 6 SIOP continental branches and regional nurse leaders
- Facilitate childhood cancer nursing and interprofessional research collaborations
- Explore opportunities for collaboration with key stakeholder organizations, such as nursing associations, patient and family advocacy organizations, foundations, and healthcare organizations
