Childhood cancer is under the spotlight in Europe's Beating Cancer Plan

One day before World Cancer Day, the European Commission formally released Europe's Beating Cancer Plan on 3 February 2021.

The plan puts childhood cancer under the spotlight with the launch of 'Helping Children with Cancer Initiative' to ensure that children have access to rapid and optimal cancer detection, diagnosis, treatment and care.

This initiative will facilitate access to early diagnosis and quality treatment through the network of centres of excellence, which are best encompassed in the European Reference Network for paediatric cancers (ERN PaedCan). It will also support training and enable the sharing of best practice and standards of care for children with cancer, complementing the actions implemented within the European Reference Networks.

SIOP Europe, CCI Europe and PanCare (the European organisations representing healthcare professionals, childhood cancer parent and patient groups, and the childhood cancer survivorship community, respectively) welcome Europe's Beating Cancer Plan marking the beginning of a new era in cancer prevention and care. It is hopeful that the initiatives on paediatric cancer will increase understanding of cancer initiation and progression, boost the transformation of care and improve diagnostics, treatment, and survivorship support and thus further strengthen the existing cooperation between paediatric, adolescent and adult oncology.

The European childhood cancer community is delighted that childhood cancer is now under the spotlight in the EU Cancer Plan. Our community including paediatric haemato-oncologists, parents, patients, and survivors is now looking forward to shaping the implementation of these proposals building on existing projects and structures in the community.

International Childhood Cancer Awareness Day (ICCD 2021)

Action to Improve Access to Medicines for Paediatric Cancers in Europe: Eradicating inequalities and addressing unmet needs

Kindly hosted by MEP Loucas Fourlas, the ICCD2021 Webinar took place on 3 February and more than 200 participants joined.

The webinar included pre-recorded video addresses by Ursula von der Leyen, President of the European Commission; Stella Kyriakides, Commissioner for Health and Food Safety; Manfred Weber, EPP Chairman & MEP; Veronique Trillet-Lenoir, MEP (Renew, France), Rapporteur of Special Committee on Beating Cancer (BECA); Bartosz Arłukowicz, MEP (EPP, Poland), Chair of Special Committee on Beating Cancer (BECA); and many Members of the European Parliament as well as European Commission.

ICCD2021 built on the <u>6 Key Recommendations</u> of the paediatric cancer community following the European Commission's Evaluation of the Legislation for Medicines for Rare Diseases and Children. Parents and academia discussed the unmet needs and current projects to foster equal access to innovative, essential, and supportive care medicines. Topics included shortages, therapeutic innovation, and pricing. Insights from leading European Union representatives were sought. The synergic roles of the Pharmaceutical Strategy for Europe, Europe's Beating Cancer Plan and EU research investments in addressing these issues was discussed by all stakeholders.

European Parliament's Special Committee on Beating Cancer (BECA) hosted a Hearing on Childhood and Rare Cancers

On 23 February, the Special Committee on Beating Cancer put the spotlight on paediatric, adolescent and rare cancers. The public hearing addressed research, treatment and rare cancer care and the rights and needs of patients, parents and survivors and caregivers. Ewa Kopacz MEP (EPP, Poland), Vice-President of the European Parliament and Coordinator on Children's Rights, opened the hearing with introductory remarks.

SIOP Europe and CCI Europe represented the voice of the community by highlighting the unmet medical needs in Europe and addressing over 30 prominent questions from various MEPs with concrete solutions to improve the reality of childhood cancers in Europe. Veronique Trillet-Lenoir, MEP (Renew, France), Rapporteur of BECA said she will submit a report on behalf of BECA that will



also address issues of childhood cancers. Bartosz Arłukowicz, MEP (EPP, Poland), Chair of BECA concluded the meeting stating that needs of childhood cancer patients and survivors must be met.

Recommendations for paediatric cancer following launch of the Pharmaceutical Strategy for Europe

On 25 November 2020, the European Commission released the <u>Pharmaceutical Strategy</u> for Europe and launched the <u>Roadmap Consultation</u> on the Orphan and Paediatric Regulations. This follows the publication of the European Commission evaluation of the legislation for medicines for rare diseases and children earlier this year.

On this occasion, the European childhood cancer community unveiled the <u>6 Key Recommendations</u> to advance patients' access to medicines, accelerate innovation and improve regulatory environment for children and adolescents with cancer.
