On the occasion of the 15th International Childhood Cancer Day (ICCD), Childhood Cancer International, with the initiative of the CCI Europe team (headed by Anita Kienesberger), the creative inputs of the team from the premier Swedish advertising agency Garbergs and the technical support of

Swedish member organization Barncancerfonden, created and launched the distinctive global awareness campaign “Child4Child” (www.child4child.com).

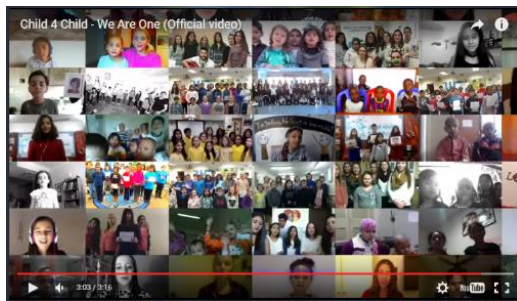
Christophe Beck, the composer for Disney’s smash hit “Frozen”, together with his 12 year old daughter Sophie, wrote a new song “We Are One” capturing the journey and the spirit of kids courageously fighting cancer as “warriors”. The children of the world were invited to “Raise Your Voice Against Childhood Cancer” by joining, singing and

Close to a million kids from all over the world, contributed their creative and personal versions of the song. More than 242 million viewed the various postings in different sites. creation of public policy addressing this issue as well as decrease the burden on families of children with cancer.

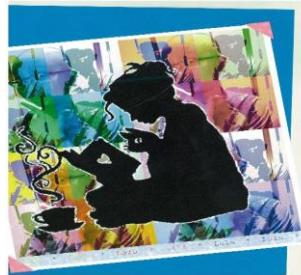

Poonam Bagai, CanKids founder and head explains the reason for the project : "Gender discrimination in our country is prevalent at all levels. In a study in Haryana in 2013, we found that girls with cancer seem to be facing discrimination as compared to boys. Some parents do not even want to inform

relatives or neighbors about this ailment as it could hamper the marriage prospects of their other children.
